

Sustainability Policy Statement

Sustainability is an extremely important issue in any Corramore project. We have realised the importance of this issue, and have now achieved full ISO 14001 accreditation. We will approach every project by looking at the economic, social and environmental impact of the project, and taking measures where possible to minimise the impact of project on the environment. We will do this on numerous levels starting with the materials specified, and where possible sourcing them from sustainable and renewable resources. We will also consider best practice where possible to minimise the amounts of materials used.

We have identified the issue of waste on numerous levels, and our goals are to significantly reduce the waste being created, both from the viewpoint of not bringing it on to site in the first place, and also by segregating our waste and recycling as much as possible. On larger projects we will liaise with our sub-contractors and suppliers to minimise the amount of waste they create, in particular addressing the amount of packaging required for the safe delivery of materials.

We will also continually monitor the fuel usage of plant and machinery, and ensure that all machinery is well maintained to reduce fuel consumption. We will protect the environment where possible through the safe storage of hazardous materials, minimising the usage of hazardous materials and considering alternative environmental products, and reducing noise and air pollution to absolute minimums.

We will also promote the use of micro renewable energy sources where possible, and make all efforts to educate our clients in their use, and provide detailed costings for these products with a view to trying to demonstrate the life cycle cost of the products, rather than concentrating on purely the initial capital costs.

In today's environment, the entire design and construction team have a social responsibility to promote and encourage the use of sustainable products where possible, and to educate their clients in their benefits from a social, economic and environmental perspective.
